ECO-SAFETY CORNER: CHINESE MITTEN CRAB A "LUSTY CRUSTY" HEADS FOR RIVER

At first I was thinking of all sorts of cute headlines but this could be a very serious threat. Chinese mitten crabs have been spotted in the St. Lawrence River and the Hudson is one of four US Rivers ranked as highly vulnerable to invasion according to the US Fish and Wildlife Service.

They first appeared in Europe in the early 1900s and in our Pacific northwest in the early 1990s. Like the zebra mussels, these bad boys have the power to change ecosystems. It's so serious there even wanted posters out in Oregon (see below).

Chinese mitten crabs live in fresh water for 2 to 3 years. When they become adults, the crabs migrate to brackish or saltwater in order to reproduce. And they do travel. Reports from China indicate they have been found over 750 miles up rivers from the ocean. One female is capable of producing a million eggs. Larvae live for a few months in the plankton then settle onshore in the late spring or early summer. Then they start to become unruly and head upstream and burrow in stream banks. It's this burrowing activity that causes bank erosion, as the network of *tunnels* is vast and complex. When population densities are high, they can clog water intakes, collapse stream banks and riprap, and damage fishing nets. Plus they have few natural predators.

Man is one predator. It seems that the ovaries of the female, are considered an aphrodisiac in China. The Chinese also eat the crabs. Even several biologists have suggested *eating the crabs into retreat*. But don't plan on starting a business anytime soon. It's currently illegal to import them in New York.

The fuzz on the claws is how they got their name.
