SAFE BOATING THROUGH EDUCATION

The Boating Course at Haviland Middle School of 20 students is progressing very well with the help from five of our members. Attendance has been exceptional with only two students missing one class each. The schedule continues on Thursday evenings from 7 to 9 and will conclude on May 26.

Our Annual Education Meeting is scheduled for May 18th at the Stonehedge Restaurant, Rt 9W West Park. It is very important that we acknowledge the accomplishments of our students, instructors and others members who have aided in our education programs during this past year.

As mentioned in a previous article the Boat Smart Course is a shortened course of only eight hours that meets the requirements of the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators and is also an acceptable requirement for membership in USPS upon passing the exam for this course. It would greatly enhance our exposure to the public and also provide greater possibilities of increasing our membership. Our District Commander, Fred Mangelsdorf, has set a goal of having the D2 Squadrons conducting a Boating Course every month and with Boat Smart we could accomplish this. We in Mid-Hudson should be the leader of "Getting Back to Basics" and do this.

We presently have four people that have bought the America's Boating Course and will need to take their proctored exams in the near future. Last year we did 19 of these so we can probably expect many more come.


