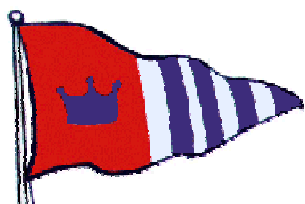

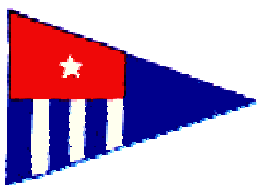

The Health Corner

This is the first in a series of articles that I hope will pique your interest in optimal health so that you will be able to enjoy boating to the fullest. Many have invested much money into their beautiful crafts and would like to enjoy their time in the best of health. It might be interesting if you know where I was health wise and where I am now and why my passion is to help others proactively achieve optimal health.

Perhaps I should start with a little bit about us. My husband, Ed has always had an interest in boating, having grown up spending much time piloting his parent's boat. When our 2 children came along, boating was put on the back burner and we started cruising on

land in a motor home. This was easier as we also had 2 Huskies that loved to go everywhere with us. With my health problem, boating was out of the question. Now that we are retired, children are grown and no pets to worry about, we are freer to pursue a more nautical lifestyle and the Power Squadron is a terrific group of like-minded people that we have so enjoyed spending time with.

When I was a Junior in College, I was riding as a passenger in a little MG and the person driving was going a bit too fast around some windy roads. The car went over an embankment and I was thrown out. I suffered a severe concussion with loss of memory and a serious back injury. Only by the grace of God did I survive. At the time, doctors told me that I would have trouble walking and especially climbing steps by the time I was 35. They advised buying a house on one level, so we bought a Ranch. My back was getting worse and worse due to the scar tissue that had built up on my spine. It was very painful bending down trying to pick something up or vacuum under furniture. I had to ease myself down by using the couch or a chair or someone to help them and me I needed help to get up. I was 5'2" and 125 pounds, a bit lighter than I am today. By the time I was 36, I was in constant pain.

When I was in my mid 20's, I developed a real interest in nutrition as I had developed blood clots and could hardly breathe and felt that proper nutrition might be the solution to my problem. I ate a healthy diet, but obviously lacked something. The doctor told me that the blood clots were caused by the birth control pills I was on after we got married. He neglected to tell me that blood clots were a possibility, since as he said, it only happens to 1 in 200,000 women. He said to stop and in time, maybe a year, they would clear up, but having a Biology background, I knew the dangers and questioned him. He said that I was a walking time bomb and that a clot could travel to my brain and cause a stroke or to my heart and cause a heart attack. I did my research and started on several natural supplements from the health food store. After a few months, the clots disappeared. My back was not getting any better and by now I had been taking these supplements for 10 years.

A neighbor suggested that I start on a particular brand, so Eddie and I decided to give it a try. We were the #1 skeptics when she said that we would feel better within 2 months time. Eddie told her "you are a neighbor and we will buy them to help you,

but don't tell us we will feel better." After all, I had studied and researched nutrition so how could she know more? Was I a bit arrogant and distrusting? Absolutely!! Well, within a short time, I had to eat humble pie. We had more energy and Eddie's bursitis disappeared.

My back injury was very severe and it took 4 years to completely heal so much so that I could do anything physical including hiking, jogging and most exciting to me bending and stretching, pain free! To put it mildly, I was sold on these products.

Then 13 years ago, I was in a scooter accident where I broke my left leg in 8 places and my right arm. That was a tragic, yet enlightening experience for me. But, in the interest of not making this too long we will address this in an upcoming Health Corner.

Court Ruling Poses Serious Threat to Boating

A court ruling intended to prevent invasive species from being brought into US waters in the ballast tanks of freighters and tankers requires the EPA to create a permitting process. Unfortunately, as it now stands, the process will include pleasure craft. I.e: you will have to get a permit for discharge of your engine cooling water, grey water discharge, deck runoff, etc.

A new recently created bill; S. 2766, the Clean Boating Act of 2008; would exempt pleasure craft from the burden and expense of obtaining an EPA permit. And would eliminate the need for EPA to add the bureaucracy for handling the millions of pleasure boats.

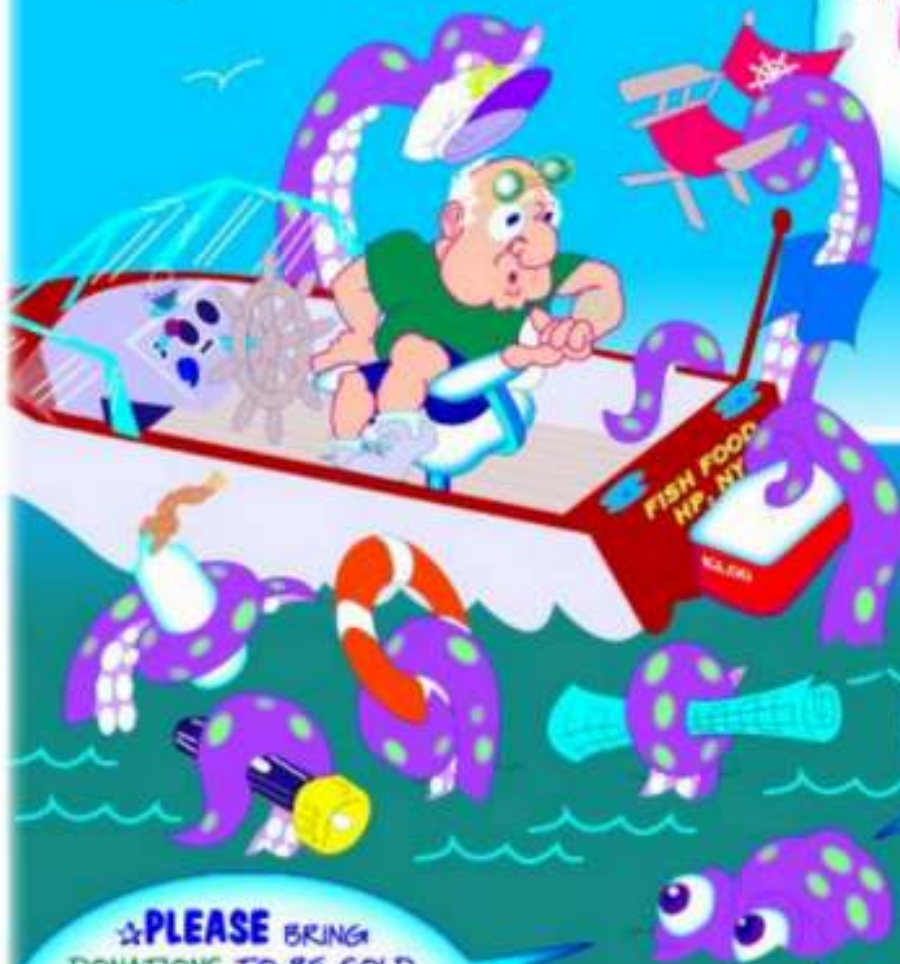
